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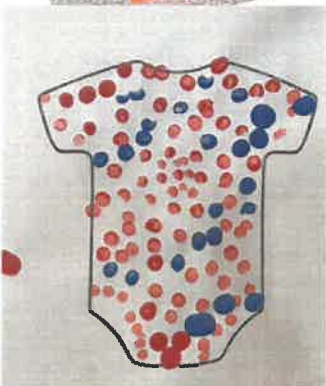
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Reception

This week we have been revising phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs in phonics. The children have been playing reading games, writing messages and engaging with whole class reading sessions to support this.

In maths we have continued to work on numberbonds within 5. Numberbonds are when 2 numbers go together to make a new number e.g. 4 and 1 make 5, 3 and 2 make 5, 5 and 0 make 5. In Reception we aim for all children to recall these number facts mentally.

We have had lots of fun introducing our 1990's theme to the children for the Queen's jubilee. Over the next 2 weeks the children will be learning to dance the Macarena and sing the Spice Girls song 'Spice Up Your Life'. So far they have learnt the 1st verse and chorus - it would be great to hear that the children have also been practising at home - we have told them that lots of mummy's and daddy's will know the words!!





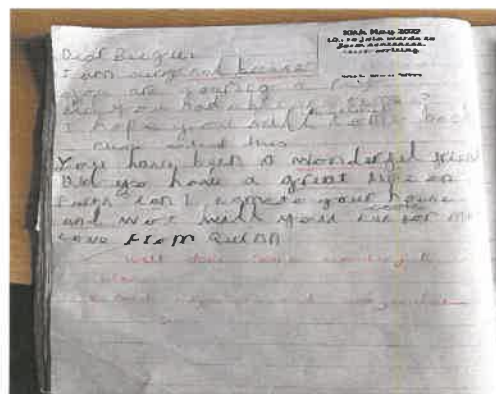
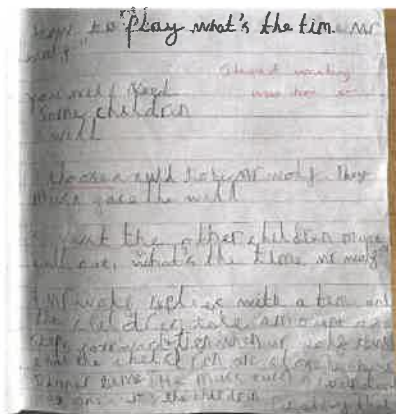
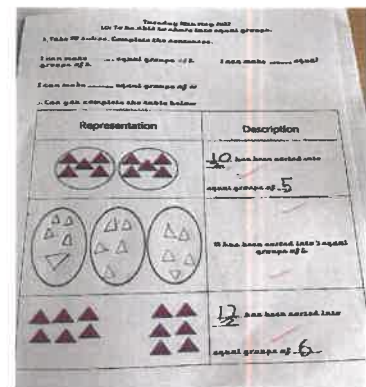
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Year 1

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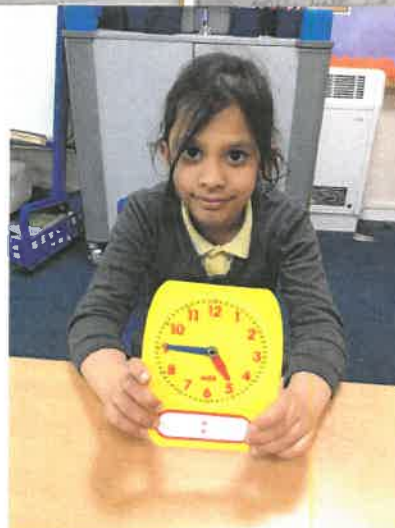
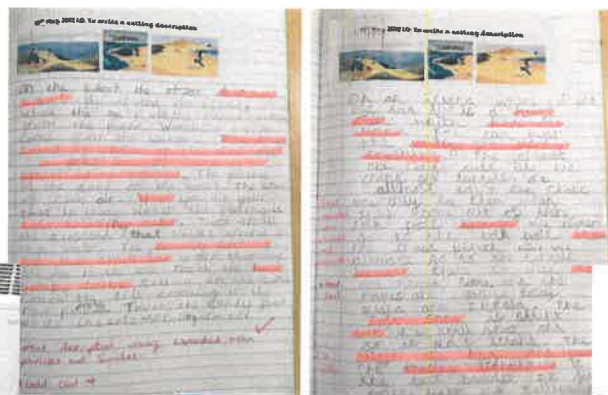


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Year 2

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Year 5

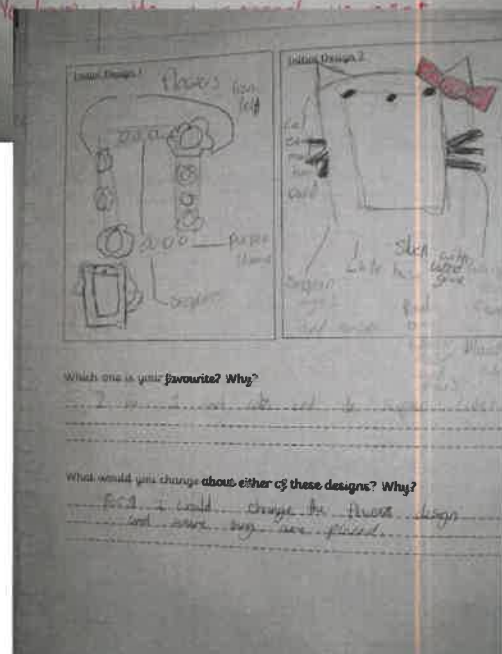
