Would You Make A Good School Governor?














Growing the right way for a bigger, better Peterborough





All over the country, school governors are helping headteachers and staff in schools to promote high standards of educational attainment. Here in Peterborough, we are keen to help schools to attract volunteers from the community to become school governors. We are looking for people who can bring energy, ideas and experience of life to support school staff in the organisation and management of schools. Governors don't need formal qualifications or particular skills. Everyone has something to offer. School governorship provides opportunities to develop new skills and practice existing ones.

Governors do need to be able to dedicate some time to their role, typically two governing body meetings a term, as well as being prepared to serve on at least one of the governing body's committees. The Local Authority provides a training programme to help and support governors in learning about their role and responsibilities.

What do governors do?

Together with the headteacher, governors set the future direction for the school and decide how the school's budget should be spent. Governing bodies make decisions collectively on matters such as performance targets, school policies, the school's improvement/ development plan, and the school's staffing structure.

Governors monitor the impact of policies and oversee the use of the school budget. They report to parents on the school's achievements and respond to inspection recommendations. They hear appeals from pupils and staff and consider complaints.

Governors provide the headteacher with support and advice, drawing on their knowledge and experience. They ask searching questions, but respect the headteacher's position as professional leader of the school.

- I have not been removed from the office of charity trustee or trustee for a charity by the Charity Commissioners or High Court on grounds of any misconduct or mismanagement, or under Section 34 of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 from participating in the management or control of any body;
- I am not included in the list of people considered by the Secretary of State as unsuitable to work with children and I am not disqualified from working with children or subject to a direction under Section 142 of the Education Act 2002;
- **I am not** disqualified from registration for childminding, providing day care or under Part 3 of the Childcare Act 2006;
- I have not received a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of not less than three months (without the option of a fine) in the last five years
- I have not received a prison sentence of two-and-a-half years or more in the 20 years before becoming a governor and I have not any time received a prison sentence of five years or more;

- I do not already hold a governorship at the same school.

School Governor Categories

Most governors serve for a four-year term of office

- Parent governors Elected by parents/carers of pupils on the school roll at the time of election. They must be parents/carers of pupils on the school roll to be eligible to stand for election. Parent governors do not have to stand down if their child leaves the school during their term of office, but they are only eligible to stand for re-election at the end of their term of office if they still have a child on the school roll. If there are not enough eligible candidates to fill the number of vacancies, the governing body may appoint someone from outside the school community who has one or more children aged between 5 and 16.
- LEA governors Governors appointed by the Local Authority from nominations put forward by the local political party secretaries, governing body or school.
- Staff governors Elected by, and from, staff at the school. The headteacher is a staff governor unless he or she chooses not to be.
- **Community governors** Governors nominated and appointed by the governing body. These are people who are representative of the local community. They are chosen to reflect a balance of interests and often include members of the local business community.
- **Foundation governors** Appointed by the people or organisations named in the instrument of government of a foundation or voluntary aided school.
- Partnership governors Nominated by parents of pupils on the school roll of a foundation school, and by other members of the community served by the school. Nominees must be members of the community served by the school who are committed to the good government and success of the school. The governing body appoints partnership governors from among those nominated. If there are not enough eligible nominees the governing body may appoint their own nominees.
